National Flag: The Sri Lankan people (Sinhalese) have a lion as their ancestor, so the national flag features a lion holding a sword. The lion is a symbol of courage, strength and dignity. Yellow represents Buddhists, Green represents Muslims & Orange represents Tamils. It also means "Shining Island".



Area: Approximately 65,610 km² (Approximately 0.8 times of Hokkaido Island in Japan).

Population: Approximately 22.97 million as of 2023 (Between year 2014 to 2023, each year approximately 192,400 population growth).

Official Languages: Sinhala, English & Tamil.

Religion: Buddhism, Hinduism, Islam, Christianity.

Currency: Sri Lankan Rupee (LKR).

Climate: Tropical Lowland (24°C to 30°C) & Highland (12°C to 20°C).

Location: South Asia, an Island Nation in the Indian Ocean (Referred to as PEARL of Indian Ocean).

Flight Time: Direct Flights from Narita International Airport are available about four times a week, with a flight time of about 9 hours.

Tourists Arrivals : Approximately 719,978 in Year 2022, Approximately 1,487,303 in Year 2023, Approximately 2,053,465 in Year 2024, Approximately 2,362,521 in Year 2025,

January–May 2026: Over 1.02 million tourist arrivals.

Relationship with Japan

Trade: Sri Lanka and Japan trade with each other, and Japan is a valuable trading partner for Sri Lanka. Exports from Japan include machinery and electronics, while exports from Sri Lanka include tea and gems.

Investment: Japanese companies have invested in Sri Lanka, and investments can be seen in the manufacturing and service industries.

Speech by Finance Minister, Junius Richard Jayewardena

Monument to the former President of Sri Lanka at Kotoku-in, a Buddhist Temple that enshrines , Kamakura Daibutsu (Great Buddha of Kamakura).

At the San Francisco Peace Conference held in 1951 to end the state of war after World War II, J. R. Jayewardene, Sri Lanka's representative, preached tolerance and love towards Japan, appealed for the abandonment of claims for reparations, and laid the path for Japan to return to the international community, claiming that a completely independent and free Japan was necessary for the future of Asia. He used the words of Buddha to appeal, **"HATRED CEASES NOT BY HATRED BUT LOVE"**, It is said that this speech even moved some of the victorious countries that were calling for

severe sanctions against Japan at the time, and played a very important role in Japan's reconstruction.

Specialties and Famous Products of Sri Lanka

Ceylon Tea

Sri Lanka is the second largest producer of black tea in the world. It is also the largest exporter in the world. It is known as one of the world's top quality black teas.

It is also used in Kirin's popular product "Afternoon Tea" in Japan and is known for its good balance of richness and astringency.

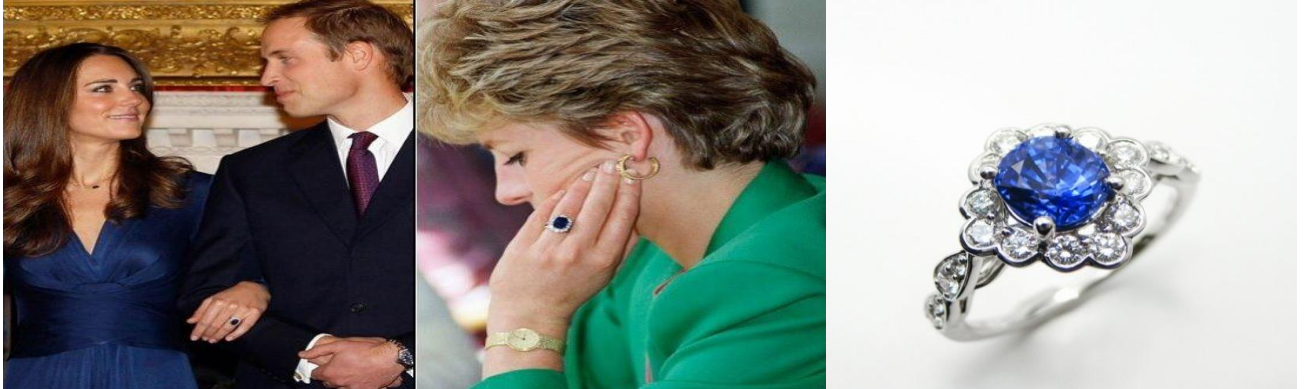
A Treasure Trove of Tropical Fruits

Many other gemstones are also produced, including cat's eye, also known as lion's eye, designated as the national stone of Sri Lanka, topaz, aquamarine, amethyst, tourmaline, garnet, and quartz, making Sri Lanka one of the world's leading producers of gemstones. They are popular not only as jewelry, but also as collection items.

you can observe herds of elephants in their natural environment have also become popular, allowing you to see them living freely up close.

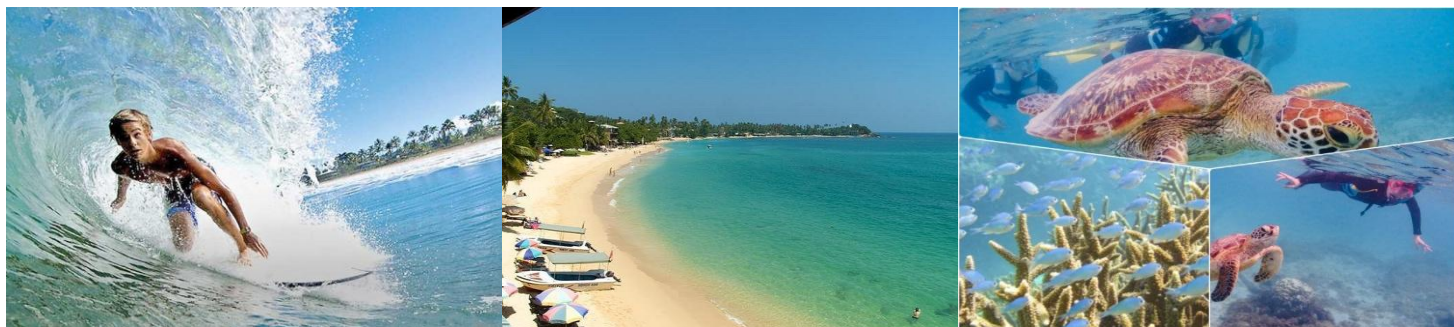


AYURVEDA – The World’s Oldest Traditional Medicine

Shirodhara, which heals the head by pouring oil or herbal decoctions on the forehead is also called "brain massage".

The Temple of the Tooth of the “Sri Dalada Maligawa” is a Buddhist holy site located in the city of Kandy. It enshrines the left canine tooth of the Buddha and Sri Lanka is the only country in the world that houses the tooth of the Buddha. The tooth of the Buddha was brought to Sri Lanka from India around the 4th century and since then it has been considered a symbol of royal authority and has been protected by various dynasties. The tooth was moved to Kandy at the end of the 16th century and has since played an important role as a symbol of the

Kandy Kingdom. The Temple of the Tooth is an important symbol of Sri Lanka’s Buddhist culture and history and is visited by many pilgrims and tourists daily.

Sri Lanka's Future Potential – Port City Project

Sri Lanka's Port City is a large-scale urban development project located in Colombo Port, the largest port in Colombo, Sri Lanka's leading commercial city. Approximately 200 ships pass through Sri Lankan waters every day and just average 10 ships call at Sri Lankan ports per day and the network with shipping companies is wide. The project is being carried out with the support of China and began with the creation of an artificial island. Port City aims to promote Sri Lanka's economic development and make Colombo the economic hub of the region. It is planned to include a variety of facilities such as commercial, residential, leisure, and education. Approximately 269 hectares of land has been reclaimed. Port City is expected to attract foreign direct investment (FDI) and create new businesses and jobs. Industries such as Finance, IT, and Tourism are expected to benefit. It is a project that will have a significant impact on the future of Sri Lanka and its progress and results are attracting a lot of attention.



Economic growth is expected to come from infrastructure and economic diversification, including the development of a port city and the promotion of tourism in Sri Lanka, which has beautiful natural scenery and cultural heritage. Modernization of agriculture and manufacturing and the promotion of the digital economy also combine to create the elements of economic growth.
